

Other dealers use a variety including 'fine' which I would rather leave to coins etc. Illus = illustrations (as opposed to 'plates'); ex lib = had an earlier life in library service (generally public) and is showing signs of wear (these books are generally 1st editions mores the pity but in this catalogue most have been restored); eps + end papers, front and rear, ex libris or 'book plate'; indicates it came from a private collection and has a book plate stuck in the front end papers. Welcome to our 20%~off Christmas catalogue – with a couple of notable exceptions. Apologies for missing the November list but we were overcome with the volume of the SIMMO project. It's been a five and a half year slog on this project which culminated on 1 Nov last when we launched the book 'SIMMO: A Biography of Ray Simpson, VC, DCM, One of Australia's Greatest Soldiers', written by my good self with Peter Lutley rounding up all the research material. It's taken so long because of the sheer volume of data available. Pete came up with about 10 large lever arch files full of stuff including transcripts of over 100 interviews. (well done Pete!) The book covers from his childhood to his many combat tours. He served at the tail end of WW2 in the South-West Pacific Campaign, three years in Korea, two years in Malaya, helped establish the 1 SAS Company at Swanbourne in 1957 and in 1962, was among the first 30 AATTV member for Vietnam. He wasn't so lucky on his second tour in 1964 when he was badly wounded in the upper leg. Many men have died with lesser wounds but not Simmo. He fought back and served on. You will have to buy the book to find out what happens next. We're doing this project pro bono with all proceeds going to charity (so no discount on SIMMO). We have been getting a great response, so with only 1,000 books in the print run I expect most of them to be sold before Christmas and at \$65 for a high quality hard back in dust-wrapper it will be an ideal Christmas present (Dad or Grand Dad as well as the younger collector.) There are a lot more outstanding titles in this list particularly two unit histories, the **3rd** Bn, AIF (Randwick to Hargicourt), and the 11th Bn, AIF (Legs Eleven). Both are rare 1st editions but are also offered without the discount. They have been rebound in quarter Moroccan leather, ribbed spines and sensational slip cases. The catalogue has a good balance of titles in aviation, espionage, military general, Napoleonic, Naval, Special Forces and of course WW1 and WW2.. Many have never seen the light of day. Also, we have a nice little list of 'Late Inclusions' at the very back. Very pleased to list these as they have all been very popular in the past. So...as usual we dedicate this list to our soldiers who may be in harms way and those who have been on Active Service and who may now be struggling to fit back in. It served in over 20 air forces for 34 years of military service. It entered Austalian service after WW2 and saw extensive action in Korea with 77 Sqn. The NZAF also flew Mustangs in four sqns, vg cond, **A\$75**.

They really made their name with the legendary Spitfire in its various Marks in WW2, vg cond and difficult to find in 1st ed, **A\$65.**

The Sunderland flying boat of WW2 and later was their most famous, vg cond and hard to find, A\$65.

Ian Allan Ltd, London, 1974. 1st ed, 4to in protected d/w, fully illustrated in b/w, pp160, **the Hawker Hurricane was the world's first operational eight-gun monoplane fighter to achieve more than 300mph in level flight. It was the RAF's first front-line fighter and played the main role in the Battle of Britain, vg cond, A\$32.

The white pilots were singled out by Mugabe and systematically held & tortured. Eventually all except for three high-ranking officers were released, vg cond and now scarce, **A\$85**.
