

We were on track to sell the last of them by ANZAC Day but we still have stock available. It's such a beautiful, high quality book that anyone would be pleased to have it in their library. It tells the harrowing story of a simple man who taught himself most things, spent years in a boys home and was an indentured labourer on a dairy farm at aged 11. He was always keen to join the army and got his wish on his 18th birthday. He was quite a naughty boy in his first few years in the army so much so he had a rap sheet as long as his arm by the time he was demobed in 1947. When he signed up for the Korean War in 1950 he joined under his brother Robert's name fearing his conduct sheet would prevent him from rejoining. From there on in he was a dedicated and loyal soldier who saw his soldiers as his mates and family. Brings a tear to the eye to read this stuff. This list is accompanied by the SIMMO order form for those wishing to buy one. This can be posted or emailed to us. For those who may be interested we are investigating getting a few copies done in leather, numbered and signed. This process is ongoing with hopefully, some idea of costs and availability by the end of the financial year. It won't be cheap folks, but that's the nature of unique, desirable and limited editions. But it will be first in best dressed and I don't mind people reserving a copy now. Let me know if interested and I'll put you on the list. I'm also investigating doing a few in the remainder of the emu leather we used for the SAS Pictorial History in 1997. (and no, they are NOT available – long gone!). This was quite a unique leather to be using for a book (we did 152 of them). It is a rustic finish with the feather holes very much in evidence. It will be very limited, so if you have the emu bound Pictorial History this would make a very nice set. So, as you can see, it will be a very limited production.

There are many other good titles in this bigger than normal list especially the Napoleonic section which I haven't included for a couple of lists. Also the American Civil War again makes an appearance after an absence of some months. Such a savage war that one. Over 650,000 killed in action or died of wounds and/or disease. As usual it is a big list of WW1 and WW2 titles which stands to reason because there are possibly many times more books written about these disastrous conflicts than other wars. I don't list very much material from recent conflicts as it is quite limited to the odd generals 'my war' recollections and a few general titles. Needless to say we're waiting for the official unit histories from Iraq and Afghanistan which won't be written any time soon.
