

Welcome to Catalogue #216 of March 2019. Whilst it's only a short list this time, there are some memorable titles on it. Here in the West we've had some scorching weather (as February always is) but nothing to match the crazy weather in the Eastern states from floods and bushfires. The loss of life is always worrying especially losing thousands of head of live stock to floods. And when most of Qld and northern NSW are in severe drought, along comes serious floods and no new dams to fill. Whoever decided we didn't need any new dams after 'those that know' advocated they be built have failed the pub test and need to be thrown out on their ears. At times like this I always wonder about the great books that are lost in floods and fires. Never to be rescued and gone forever. In times of war it's always a tragedy when cities, towns, libraries and homes are destroyed but to me, it's always a tragedy to lose valuable books to a flood or fire. My thinking is there are things we can do to protect our valuable written word as we do with valuable wine. A fire and flood-proof room inside one's house would be a start. I suppose you're saying 'it's alright for him. He lives in the city far away from fire and flood'. That may be so but we can't always rely on insurance when some books are so rare and valuable that when they're gone, that's it. Extinction. A reprint does guarantee the survival of the written word but the original 1st edition is no more. And it makes it doubly problematic when publishing houses (and individuals) decide to do a very small print run. With luck authors and publishers stick to the 'legal lodgment' rules and send a copy to the National Library in Canberra who try very hard to digitize every book. This means the written word is there for all to see on your computer at least. The provenance of some of these books cannot be replicated such as losing signed copies from some of our great war heroes who are no longer with us. That can't be replaced. In the meantime lets hope that losses in the recent fires and floods are limited to replaceable items and not rare books. As usual this catalogue is dedicated to servicemen/women who aren't travelling too well. Also for those on Active Service as we speak. Come home safely. Cheers and Via con Dios M&J

**216/25.** (4735) Hoyle, Arthur, DFC. **Hughie Edwards, VC: The Fortunate Airman.** AMHP, Sydney, 2000 (fp1999). Reprint, large 8vo in illus boards, plates, index, biblio, pp211, \*\**Air Commodore Hughie Edwards was the most highly decorated Australian serviceman of WW2 winning the VC, DSC and DFC, a good biography, new*, **A\$45.** 

**216/26.** (5965) Lodge, Brett. Lavarack: Rival General. Allen & Unwin (Army History Unit Bio Series), Sydney, 1998. 1st ed, 8vo in card covers, plates, chapter notes, extensive biblio, index, pp339, \*\**General Lavarack commanded the Australian Army (CGS) between 1935 and 1939. He dropped a rank to go to war and was white-anted by Blamey who saw him as a rival to his power. He was ruthlessly consigned to obscurity, vg cond, A\$24.*

He showed great courage at Poziers where he was called 'the most fearless and gallant soldier I have ever seen'. He saw active service in the Boer War (with the Brits), and joined the 1st AIF in 1914 as a Provisional Captain and left it 5 years later a knighted Major-General. He won renown on Gallipoli and as a brigade and divisional commander on the Western Front. He later served as a Federal politician between the wars, new, A\$36.*

Only one plane survived - the rest were shot down, 31 aircrew KIA, 13 POW of which Trent was one. POW in STALAG LUFT 3, part of the Great Escape, the 50 who were recaptured were murdered by the Gestapo, vg cond,* **A\$34.** 

**216/32.** (6324) Wray, Christopher. **Sir James Whiteside McCay: A Turbulent Life.** Oxford Uni Press, Melbourne, 2002. 1st ed, 8vo in d/w, plates, maps, source notes, biblio, index, pp280, \*\*the enigma that was Sir James Whiteside McCay. Minister for Defence in 1903, he led a Brigade with his walking stick; was Chief of Intelligence and mentored the great Monash - but he became the 'most disliked general' - this book clears up the mystery, new, **A\$38.**
