(1484) Cole, Barbara. **Sabotage and Torture: (the destruction of the Rhodesian Air Force in 1980).** Three Knights, RSA, 1988. 1st ed, 8vo in d/w, plates and illustrations, nominal roll of all involved & their locations (in 1988), biblio, index, pp209, **saboteurs destroyed or damaged 13 aircraft including the new Hawk FGA/bombers on the ground destroying half Zimbabwe's airforce. The white pilots were singled out by Mugabe and systematically held & tortured. Eventually all except for three high-ranking officers were released, vg cond and now scarce, **A\$70**.

(10440) Johnson, Frank (ed). **R.A.A.F Over Europe.** Eyre & Spottiswoode, London, 1946. 1st ed, 8von in blue cloth, plates, stats list, pp189 (54 pages of plates at rear), **the RAAF squadrons despatched to England for the war in Europe in 1939 lost 5,488 killed or missing. They fought well above their weight winning 2 x VCs, 56 x DSOs (and 5 x Bars), 1,739 DFCs (and 11 x Bars) etc, vg cond, **A\$36.**

(5944) Leebold, Arthur. **Silent Victory: Breaking the Japanese Air-blockade between Australia and Europe.** Banner Books, ACT, 1995. 1st ed, large 8vo in d/w, plates, maps, rolls of QANTAS aircrews, biblio, index, pp111, ***the Catalina was used as the only alternative for the long air route to Ceylon (Sri Lanka) and India. QANTAS and the RAAF, undertook this secret passenger service from Perth, new*, **A\$38.**

Osprey, London, 1988. 1st ed, 4to in d/w, profusely illus, index, biblio, pp289, **the struggle by the Sth Vietnamese airforce to wage a credible air campaign against ground troops with obsolete aircraft and very questionable maintenance skills, vg cond and now scarce, A\$45.

227/8. (11014) Nowarra, Heinz J. **The Messerschmitt 109: A Famous German Fighter.** Harleyford Publications, UK, 1966 (fp1963). Revised ed, 4to in protected d/w, fully illustrated in colour and b/w, list of planes brought down during the Battle of Britain, glossary, pers. Index, pp200, **the story of the ME109, Germany's best fighter and the 'most built' of all time, bumped d/w else good cond, A\$48.

227/9. (11015) Nowarra, Heinz J. **The Focke-Wulf 190: A Famous German Fighter.** Harleyford Publications, UK, 1965. 1st ed, 4to in protected d/w, fully illustrated in colour and b/w, tables listing all variations and models and armaments, index, pp212, ***the FW190 was a formidable aircraft but its designer fought long and hard to get it accepted by the Luftwaffe. A Pilot With the Chindits.** Collins, London, 1984. 1st ed, 8vo in d/w, map, pp272, **the author, an Australian, saw a full tour of duty with RAF Coastal Command before volunteering to serve in Burma with the Chindits. A very lucid and readable account of the war in Burma, vg cond, A\$30.

(9498) Page, Charles. **Wings of Destiny: Wing Commander Charles Learmonth, DFC & Bar and the Air War in New Guinea.** Rosenberg Publishing P/L, Sydney, 2008. 1st ed, trade 8vo in card covers, <u>signed and dedicated by the author</u>, plates and maps, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp416, ***the life and times of a great Australian airman, Charles Learmonth. He was killed when his Beaufort bomber crashed into the Indian Ocean near Perth on 6 Jan 1944. <i>He was CO of #14 Sqn out of Pearce at the time. Learmonth Airbase at Exmouth is named for him*, vg cond, **A\$38**.

Reprint, 4to in card covers, index, pp273, **the author's Lancaster was shot down over Munich in 1943. He was captured, interrogated and imprisoned in Stalag Ivb. Good story, new cond, **A\$34.**

227/17. (10412) Wallace, Gordon. **"Up in Darwin with the Dutch" A Tribute to the Mitchell Bomber Boys.** Author, Victoria, 1983. A revised ed of **"Are you there Don R?"**, 4to in card covers, <u>signed by the author</u>, numbered ed (#1362) profusely illustrated, some hilighting in text, nominal roll, pp180, ***being the true story of 18 Sqn NEI/RAAF forces from 1942 to 1950. She developed and handed out a prophalactic kit to ward of venereal deseases carried by many Les Madames in the brothels of Paris. She was lauded by many and villafied by many more, good cond and uncommon*, **A\$24**.

(6350) Weate, Mark. **Bill Newton, VC: The Short Life of a RAAF Hero.** AMHP, Sydney, 1999. 1st ed, large 8vo in laminated boards, plates, illus, three indexes, biblio, pp95, ***Newton flew a Boston over New Guinea in many daring low level targets against murder-ous anti-aircraft fire. He was shot down near Salamaua, captured by the Japanese and executed,* new, **A\$32.**

227/42. (6401) Wilkinson, Peter & Astley, Joan Bright. **Gubbins and SOE.** Pen & Sword, London, 1997 (fp1993). Reprint, trade 8vo in card covers, plates, source notes, index, pp254, **an excellent biography of Major-General Sir Colin Gubbins who commanded SOE in WW2. Both authors were also members of SOE; an excellent book, vg cond, **A\$36.**
