

Welcome to Catalogue 231, June 2020. Whilst still in the middle of the pandemic lock-down, thanks to technology we're still able to reach most of our book buyers via email, zoom and the phone. We still send a few hard-copies but far less than when we first started. It was hard copy only and all hands on deck (mothers-in-law etc) to build the catalogue, get it printed, folded and enveloped, sticking-on of stamps, bundling and posting. Our database was designed by two 17 year old genius students and it is still going strong today with over 11,000 books catalogued. What the future holds is anybody's guess. Isolation has given us pause for thought about how to enhance Imprimatur Books' place in the world. We've been hearing from many friends and buyers picking up the phone to place orders. There's nothing like a lock-down to reflect on your collection and seek out good books for your isolation. I'm always searching for new additions to the list so if you have a hoard of quality military books for sale, give me a call. My preference is to source books locally, many of which may well have passed through my hands over the years.

As for the pandemic – we're doing a remarkable job here in Australia keeping the death rate down to around 100 as other countries such as the US (100,000) - frightening with the civil unrest being unleashed across the country. 231/21. (7874) 'Vigilant'. **German War Birds.** Greenhill Books, London, 1994 (fp1931). Reprint, 8vo in d/w, book plate in prelims, plates, list of recipients who won the 'Blue Max', pp264, **the dramatic tales of air combat as fought by the best German pilots of WW1. OSS Detachment 101 was the first clandestine unit formed by Donovan and deployed in 1942 and remained there till 1945 playing a significant role in retaking the Burma Road, gen good cond and uncommon in Aust, A\$45.

(6503) Holmes, W.J. **Double-Edged Secrets: U.S. Naval Intelligence Operations in the Pacific During WW2.** Naval Institute Press, USA, 1979. 1st ed, 8vo in rubbed d/w, plates, maps, index, pp231, ***the dilemma of breaking Japanese codes with the possible result of tipping them off to USN operations. Very interesting*, vg cond, **A\$28**.
