Riding a bike in company with Min Moor and Harry Butler on the Burke & Wills track near Balranald in NSW, he bit the dust and was dead immediately. Hopefully it was one of those nopain heart attacks. No doubt he will be sorely missed by all who were influenced by him and there are many! He was here only a week or two back to pick up a book and drink coffee. We always had stimulating conversations and his work with the Z Special Association has guaranteed their memory will survive. His knowledge of asymmetric warfare and associated pathways was far beyond that to which any of us could aspire. He was an engineer by trade who came to SASR as a young officer and was instantly drawn into the realm of guerrilla warfare. He was a lateral thinker which caused some push back among those who couldn't keep up. He never took a backward step and was most forthright in his views as evidenced by his views in his book 'SNAKES IN THE JUNGLE: SPECIAL OPERATIONS IN WAR AND BUSINESS'. (sold out). His recent critique of an error-laden book about AIB/SRD and Z Special in WW2 was particularly hard hitting in the Truscott style. Which goes to show how important it is to get your facts straight when you write an historical document. To Collette and family, my deepest condolences for the loss of your husband and father, a remarkable SAS/Cdo soldier, the likes of whom, we will not have the pleasure to meet again. VALE JIM RIP. His responsibility was counter-subversion targeting communist and fascist spy rings in England. He planted agents in the Comminist Party of Great Britain, the British Union of Fascists and other pre-war extremists groups, very interesting stuff, vg cond, A\$32.*

241/28. (2812) Montagu, Ewen. **The Man Who Never Was: Operation Mincemeat, the Story of Major Martin, RM.** Evans Brothers Ltd, London, 1961. (fp1954). Reprint, 8vo in protected d/w, plates, maps as eps, inscr, pp144, **Operation Mincemeat saw a body placed in the water in the Med which carried bogus papers concerning details of the Allied landings in Sicily. The German High Command took the bait, vg cond, A\$34.

(9380) Blackmore, L.K. **Hawker: One of Aviation's Greatest Names: Aviator, Designer and Test Pilot: A Biography of Harry Hawker.** David Bateman Ltd, Auckland, 1990. 1st ed, large 8vo in good d/w, plates and maps, biblio, index, pp232, **Harry Hawker was an Australian of pioneer stock who left school at 12 and had no formal education. He went on to play a key role with Sopwith who produced the Pup and Camel in WW1 and later founded his own company producing Schneider cup winning planes. He was killed in a plane crash in 1921. In WW2, his company Hawker produced the redoubtable Hurricane fighter and the Tempest and Typhoon and later the Harrier of Falklands fame, vg cond, **A\$36.**

(11061) Brune, Peter. **Ralph Honner: Kokoda Hero.** A&U, Sydney, 2007 (fp2000 as 'We Band of Brothers'). 1st ed in this format, trade 8vo in card covers, plates and maps, chapter notes, biblio, index, pp354, **the indefatigable Ralph Honner, who led a battalion of barely trained CMF soliers against the Japs on the Kokoda Track. They did terrible damage to the forward elements of the Japanese attackers, vg cond, **A\$36.**

During a 12 month period in Korea 3RAR had three battalion commanders; Green was KIA; Ferguson sacked (still debated) and Hassett went on to great things, new, **A\$35.**

(7906) Coombes, David. **The Lionheart: A Life of Lieutenant-General Sir Talbot Hobbs: An Australian Commander in World War One.** AMHP, Sydney, 2007. 1st ed, large 8vo in d/w, plates, end-notes, abbreviations, biblio, index, pp342, ***Keith Murdoch described Sir Talbot Hobbs as 'His heart is that of a lion'. Hobbs commanded 1st Div artillery on Gallipoli and then the 5th Australian Div AIF on the Western Front. He was highly regarded & commanded his division with distinction serving at second Bullecourt, Perone and Villers-Bretonneux where he established himself as a top general. He went back to architecture in Perth after the war where he built many grand buildings,* new, **A\$75.**

(11175) Cosgrove, General Sir Peter. **You Shouldn't Have Joined...: A Memoir.** A&U, Sydney, 2020. 1st ed, large 8vo in protected d/w, <u>signed by the author</u>, colour and b/w plates, index, pp426, ***General Cosgrove was afair dinkum soldier, awarded the MC in Vietnam with 9RAR and as they say, the rest is history. This is a good read,* new, **A\$60.**

241/43. (1635) Coulthard-Clark, C.D. A Heritage of Spirit: A Biography of MajGen Sir William Throsby Bridges, KCB, CMG. MUP, Melbourne, 1979. 1st ed, 8vo in d/w, plates, index, biblio, source notes, pp220, ***Throsby Bridges was the founder of RMC Duntroon, raised the 1st AIF and was killed in action on Gallipoli (Turk sniper), a remarkable man,* vg cond, **A\$46.**

241/44. (7124) Coulthard-Clark, C.D. **No Australian Need Apply: The Troubled Career of Lieutenant-General Gordon Legge.** Allen & Unwin, Sydney, 1988. 1st ed, 8vo in d/w, plates and maps, newspaper article tipped-in, biblio, chapter notes, index, pp253, **Legge was the loser in a bitter and protracted factional feud between Australian nationalists and British imperialists within the Australian army's high comand. He was a nationalist but backed the wrong horse in WW1 - very informative of a murky period in Australia's leadership history, vg cond, A\$55.
